- 10.**EATON COUNTY DISPATCH PRESENTATION:** Presentation given by Michael Armtage, ENP Director. The presentation was regarding the reasons why Eaton County needs to upgrade its 911 radio

communication system and how it will be funded with a surcharge of up to \$1.75 per 911 capable calling device per month. The lowest cost offered to upgrade would be \$13,492,177.00 and would need to be financed over 10 years. Installation & operational capability of the new system my take up to 2 years. The other 2 existing radio systems in the emergency vehicles would still need to be maintained to allow communication with hospitals & doctors.

- 11.2017 GLAESA ANNUAL REPORT: Rodney VanDeCasteele shared the reports critical points, he pointed out the number of ambulance runs have been increasing every year. A copy of this report is kept on file at the Oneida Township Hall and at the Grand Ledge Fire Dept. for anyone to review.

13. EATON COUNTY SHERIFF PATROL PROPOSED CONTRACT CHANGE FOR ADDITIONAL PATROLING IN ONEIDA TOWNSHIP:

Tim Jungel from the Eaton County Sheriff Department asked the Oneida Township Board to consider a revision to the Contract that the Eaton County Sheriff Patrol has with Oneida Township. The revision would be to dedicate a specific Sheriff Deputy to Oneida Township and Maple Valley School; Three days a week / 8 hours a day would be dedicated to Oneida Township and two days a week / 8 hours a day would be dedicated to Maple Valley Schools. For the scheduled days the school is not in session the Deputy would patrol Oneida Township, the only times the Township would not have the deputy patrolling would be his vacation or sick days. There would be no increase to the Township cost, it would remain at \$45,000.00 per year. Maple Valley Schools would pay their same yearly contract rate. The purpose of this change to keep one of the Deputies from being laid off, due to cuts in Eaton Counties budget. Tim stated he will try to have Sheriff's Department send a draft copy of the revised contract proposed to the Township to review by the end of September.
